HEAVY AND TRACTOR-TRAILER TRUCK DRIVERS

Drive a tractor-trailer combination or a truck with a capacity of at least 26,000 pounds Gross Vehicle Weight (GVW).

BUS DRIVERS, TRANSIT AND INTERCITY
Drive bus or motor coach, including regular route operations, charters, and private carriage.

INDUSTRIAL TRUCK AND TRACTOR OPERATORS

Operate industrial trucks or tractors equipped to move materials around a warehouse, storage yard, factory, construction site, or similar location.

LOGISTICS MANAGERS

Plan, direct, or coordinate purchasing, warehousing, distribution, forecasting, customer service, or planning services.

LOGISTICS ENGINEERS

Design or analyze operational solutions for projects such as transportation optimization, network modeling, process and methods analysis, cost containment, capacity enhancement, routing and shipment optimization, or information management.

LOGISTICS ANALYSTS

Analyze product delivery or supply chain processes to identify or recommend changes.

LOGISTICIANS

Responsible for the entire life cycle of a product, including acquisition, distribution, internal allocation, delivery, and final disposal of resources.

TRANSPORTATION MANAGERS

Plan, direct, or coordinate the transportation operations within an organization or the activities of organizations that provide transportation services.

TRANSPORTATION ENGINEERS

Prepare designs, specifications, or estimates for transportation facilities. Plan modifications of existing streets, highways, or freeways to improve traffic flow.

TRANSPORTATION PLANNERS

Prepare studies for proposed transportation projects. Gather, compile, and analyze data.

Jobs in the Military

CARGO SPECIALISTS

load and unload military supplies and material using equipment such as forklifts and cranes; plan and organize loading schedules.

TRANSPORTATION SPECIALISTS

plan and assist in air, sea, and land transportation for people and cargo

VEHICLE DRIVERS

operate all types of heavy military vehicles. They drive fuel or water tank trucks, semi-tractor trailers, heavy troop transports, and passenger buses

LOGISTICIANS AND TRANSPORTATION MANAGERS

develop, review, and implement plans for coordinating many different variables such as, requirements for and availability of supplies, equipment, personnel, and transportation, specialties include aviation logistics

SUPPLY AND WAREHOUSING MANAGERS

plan and direct personnel who order, receive, store, and issue equipment and supplies.
