Physical and Occupational Therapists

Physical and occupational therapists are programs of treatment and exercise for patients disabled from illness or injury. Physical and occupational therapists plan and administer therapy to help patients adjust to disabilities, regain independence, and prepare to return to work.

Physical and Occupational Therapy Specialists

Physical and occupational therapy consists of treatment and exercise for patients disabled by illness or injury. Physical and occupational therapy specialists assist in administering treatment aimed at helping disabled patients regain strength and mobility and preparing them to return to work.

Possible Career Paths

Physical Therapists Assess, plan, organize, and participate in rehabilitative programs that improve mobility, relieve pain, increase

strength, and improve or correct disabling conditions resulting from disease or injury.

Physical Therapist Aides Under close supervision of a physical therapist or physical therapy assistant, perform only delegated, selected, or routine tasks in specific situations.

Physical Therapist Assistants Assist physical therapists in providing physical therapy treatments and procedures.

Athletic Trainers Evaluate and advise individuals to assist recovery from or avoid athletic-related injuries or illnesses, or maintain peak physical fitness.

Occupational Therapists Assess, plan, organize, and participate in rehabilitative programs that help build or restore vocational, homemaking, and daily living skills, as well as general independence, to persons with disabilities or developmental delays.
