### Clinical Psychologists

Diagnose or evaluate mental and emotional disorders of individuals through observation, interview, and psychological tests, and formulate and administer programs of treatment.

**Industrial-Organizational Psychologist** Apply principles of psychology to human resources, administration, management, sales, and marketing problems.

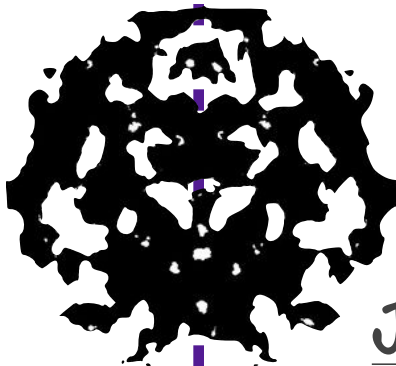
**School Psychologist** Investigate processes of learning and teaching and develop psychological principles and techniques applicable to educational problems.

**Rehabilitation Counselor** Counsel individuals to maximize the independence and employability of persons coping with personal, social, and vocational difficulties that result from birth defects, illness, disease, accidents, or the stress of daily life.

**Marriage and Family Therapist** Diagnose and treat mental and emotional disorders, whether cognitive, affective, or behavioral, within the context of marriage and family systems.

**Art Therapist** Plan or conduct art therapy sessions or programs to improve clients' physical, cognitive, or emotional well-being.

**Music Therapist** Plan, organize, or direct medically prescribed music therapy activities designed to positively influence patients' psychological or behavioral status.
